Happy Poush Sankranti

“Poush Sankranti is called Makar Sankranti because it marks the Sun's entry into the Capricorn (Makar) zodiac sign, signaling the end of winter and the start of longer days (Uttarayan) and the harvest season, celebrated across India with regional variations like kite flying in the North, Pongal in the South, Lohri in the Punjab, Bhogali Bihu: Assam. Shishur Saenkraat: Kashmir Valley, and Poush Parbon in Bengal with special sweets, holy dips, and thanksgiving rituals for the harvest. The day is also celebrated all over South Asia. Out of India, Maghe Sankranti in Nepal, Songkran in Thailand, Thingyan in Myanmar, Laos: Pi Ma Lao. Moha Sangkran in Cambodia, etc. The festival is also dedicated to Surya Dev (Sun god). The importance of Uttaarayan is exhibited in the Hindu epic Mahabharata, where Bhishma Pitamah waited for the sun to be in Uttaarayan for him to die willingly.”
